Lake Pks [1/0810/2017/AGMB [clerk to reply to Torrridge after due consideration of the case and this to be finalised at the next working group meeting. A planning issue was raised by members of public present, T.P.C. resolved to contact the relevant authorities and bring it to their attention regarding the Sunday school room occupancy.

4.Defibrillator.	Woodacott Holiday Pk have agreed to site a defibrillator on their premises as soon as one is purchased for Thornbury Hamlets.
